A. PROCEDURAL ITEMS

1. Call to Order: Board Chair Kate Plaisance called the meeting to order at 5:00 pm

Mission: The Academy for Sciences and Agriculture (AFSA), a public charter school for grades K-12, engages learners in academically rigorous, student-centered, hands-on experiences and leadership opportunities within a science, environmental education, and agricultural context.

Vision: AFSA will develop lifelong learners who are curious, care for others and have high skill levels in applied sciences, and will be prepared for a future in a diverse, global and changing society

- 2. Determination of Quorum (5 members minimum): A quorum was determined.
- 3. Approve Agenda: A motion to approve the February 28th, 2023 amended agenda with added speaker Ryan Moller as presented was made by Brady Jones. Jodi Stumpner seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.
- 4. Determination of Conflict of Interest: No conflict of interest was determined to be present.
- 5. Approval of Minutes: A motion was made to approve the January 2023 Board minutes as presented by David Smith. Jodi Stumpner seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

Guest Speaker Ryan Moeller: Ryan Moeller is an AFSA first year Social Studies teacher at the K-8 and AFSA K-12 Athletic Director. He discussed the fall sports held at AFSA including volleyball, cross country running, and co-op soccer. The current boys and girls basketball season is coming to an end. Invitation was extended to attend the boys home game 03/01/2023 at AFSA High School at 5:30 pm. Spring athletic sports at AFSA include baseball, softball, and track. Informational session will be held at Presentation Night at the High School March 2nd. Ryan shared the positive outcomes of AFSA sports including increased involvement, AFSA school spirit, student pride, relationship building between 7th/8th graders and AFSA high schoolers. Discussion was also held among the board on fundraising, student enrollment costs for sports and interest in an inhouse soccer team for next fall.

School Activities Reports

Liz Burkwald presented for AFSA K-8.

Academics:

• Finishing up STAR Testing, a few make-ups from snow days. Currently, 60% of completed tests have shown high growth in Reading and 63% in Math.

Community:

- February 10th, AFSA K-8 hosted a successful Literacy Night which was attended by 65 students in grades K-7th grade.
- AFSA K-8 students earned a school wide treat of hot chocolate for respectful, responsible, safe and #beafsa behaviors. The winning advisory within each age group also earned cookies.
- Congratulations to AFSA 7th and 8th grade duo who won the AFSA 7-12 grade talent show February 24th.

Mission:

- Contract Goal 1.1: Out of 173 students who completed their Science Fair projects received an
 average score of 77.44. This is an increase of 14 from last year. Make-up scores will be added to
 the final reporting data.
- ELP Goal 2.1: 13% of the completed Science Fair projects were in the Environmental Education Category, exceeding the goal of 10%.
- Dave Smith visited Agricultural classes for cheese tasting.

Enrollment:

- 25 Registrations received for next school year. March 1st is the deadline, so we expect to see additional applications this week.
- Enrollment for next year is at 393 for K-12, prediction is for approximately 450. 8th graders were surveyed for next year and 44 of 50 plan to stay and attend AFSA High School.
- Lottery was conducted on Feb 6, 2023 by Liz Burkwald and witnessed by Lori Lane. From the lottery, 87 of 102 applications were accepted. Waitlist of 15 students in 3, 4, 5, and 6th grade.
- Since the lottery we have received 10 more applicants, with a total of 126 applications for 2023-24 at this time.

Erik Bruner-Wiltse presented for AFSA High School.

Clubs and Extracurricular Activities:

- Infinite Reach unveiled their mural, "It's Never Too Late," with a dedication for the school on Friday February 24th. The mural represents the infinitely unique qualities of all of our students.
- Ryan Moeller will be speaking during presentation night March 2nd, regarding spring sports.
- Boys basketball season is finishing up and they are having a home game March 1st at AFSA HS.
- E-sports pre-season has begun with 12 members. The official season is starting the week of March 6th.

School Culture and Community:

• FFA week began with the national FFA President speaking to 7-12th graders at the High School and concluded with the AFSA Talent Show Friday February 24th.

- February 10th High School Leadership Conference was held at the AFSA High School with 75 students participating in team-building activities, leadership skills from AFSA Officers, and food assembly for the homeless.
- February 28th FFA Day at the Capitol. 12 students participated and met with 11 senators or representatives. Students were able to sit in on the Education and Finance Committee in the senate and the house.

Academics:

- AFSA High School February 23rd E-Learning day was productive with 87% attendance of most virtual sessions.
- The 7-9th and 10-12th grade Science Fairs were held with nearly 200 students, 32 judges, with 9 rooms. Resulting in 41 High School students eligible to attend the State Agriscience Fair March 9th at the U of M St. Paul Campus.
- March 2nd is the AFSA High School Presentation night from 4-7:00 pm. It is open to the public, families and friends to attend presentations and tour the building.

Enrollment: Current AFSA High School total enrollment is 166 students.
